PARENTAL GUIDELINES for HONORS BIOLOGY

- 1. A notebook is required to be maintained daily. This notebook contains all the materials, assignments and records of your child's progress through Honors Biology.
- 2. If your son or daughter is experiencing difficulty doing homework assignments, please have him or her write down the specific questions on paper as they arise, and ask them of me the next class period. Encourage asking questions in class. If extra help is needed or assignments need to be made-up it is the responsibility of the student to see me and make arrangements.
- 3. There may not be individual homework assignments to be handed in each day, however, this does not mean there is "nothing to do" in Honors Biology. This course is additive. One concept builds upon another and so on, thus constant review of notes and keeping up with reading will be necessary. Many assignments take time, planning and thought over a longer period of time than one day. Encourage your child not to wait to the last minute to study for tests or quizzes or to complete assignments. PLEASE EMPHASIZE RESPONSIBILITY AND PROPER PLANNING SKILLS!!!!!
- 4. Encourage daily attendance and being on time to class. Excused absences will be allowed make-up privileges within a reasonable time limit. It is the responsibility of the student to make arrangements with me for make-up work.
- 5. If you notice that your child is experiencing difficulty, poor performance or need an explanation, please Email me at rleblanc@tuhsd.k12.az.us or have your student contact me personally as soon as possible.
- 6. Each quarter the school sends progress reports of each student's performance home. There are also periodic computer printouts that are handed out in class. It is the responsibility of each student is responsible for keeping tract of his or her own points and grade percentage. Feel free to check their daily assignments and point sheets located in their notebooks to see if they are up to date and how your son or daughter progress in this class. If you would like to check your son/daughters homework or grades you may access them at my website that is listed below.
